"Is this true of other areas? If not, what are they doing differently?"

Following is excerpt from an email received from the Episcopal Cursillo Ministry ahead of their October 2019 conference. They had received an email with a number of questions from a Cursillista who had, with his wife, worked in numerous areas of leadership in the San Francisco Bay Area during the past 30 years. The three Secretariats in the Bay Area have hosted will over 1,000 Cursillo weekends since 1961.

This question seems to apply to challenges faced by Secretariats throughout the United States and Canada. They are presented here for the larger community's consideration. This is meant to encourage discussion, so please feel free to respond to your CACS Representative.

- 1—We keep having the same people as Team members. *Is this true of other areas and if not, what are they doing differently?*
- 2—In the last several years we have had a very difficult time getting candidates. It has come down to the Team Members beating the bushes themselves. *Is this true of other areas and if not, what are they doing differently?*
- 3—Our Secretariat instituted a policy that a Rector/Rectora has to have served in two **Core Team** positions. This has stifled many potential lay leaders, causing us to have fewer Cursillo Weekends. *Is this true of other areas and if not, what are they doing differently?*
- 4—Each Team has to raise in excess of \$8,000 for a Weekend location. The cost definitely distracts from the core values of Cursillo. *Is this true of other areas and if not, what are they doing differently?*

News from Across the Country

British Columbia – Has made the conscious decision to experiment with a New Shorter Weekend format. The 20th Annual Cursillo Reunion Camp-Out was a wonderful success! Cursillistas who have participated in our community since the late 1980's on through folks who joined our ranks in the last few years met together to swim, share food and fellowship, study the Gospel, worship and enjoy the great outdoors of God's creation at Rondalyn Resort in Cassidy. We had a total of 22 adults, 11 children, and 3 dogs join the celebration! As is our custom, we shared a pot-luck meal on Saturday evening, followed by an the Group Reunion Ultreya as prescribed by the Pilgrim's Guide. Kirsten Evenden delivered the witness talk, followed by a group discussion and responses to the message. Reverend Rob Hutchison officiated at a Eucharist. Over the weekend, the group also studied Max Lucado's video study "Anxious for Nothing".

Calgary – Ultreya in Sundre on August long weekend with Archbishop Greg in attendance along with 30+ Cursillistas.

Central Nfld – A new Lay Director was elected. Much of the Manual material was updated, as well as information brochures. We have been taking Cursillo Ultreyas to some of our more isolated Parishes. Some members now use Face Time instead of travelling for Secretariat meetings. All of our supplies are now catalogued and kept in one central location. The "virtuous" circle pamphlet is being used at Ultreyas and has had positive feedback.

Edmonton - We are taking Cursillo out to the parishes and held a well-attended Ultreya in Vegreville, an hour east of Edmonton, in May. Our Bishop's Teaching Day in June, normally held in Edmonton, was instead held in Devon, west of Edmonton. In late August we honored our role as Servant Community when we helped Christ Church Edmonton serve burgers and hotdogs and all the fixin's to over 150 inner-city neighbors. We incorporated our annual ice cream social into this event, which was a real treat for diners who finished off eight pails of ice cream and assorted toppings. We are ready for our AGM and Ultreya on September 20 and have a full team ready to present our 2019 Weekend October 18-20.

Niagara Huron -

* Met with Rev. Canon Dawn Davis to discuss how Cursillo fits into the Niagara Diocesan vision of reconnecting people with their faith. Discerning whether it fits better as a pre or post event for Faith Formation as currently experienced in Niagara in connection with REVIVE a Forward Movement program which she created and now oversees in at least 12 parishes in Niagara Diocese

*Conducted a Telephone Survey involving 9 areas and 20 tele phoners between March 1 to June 30th. A good number of respondents have no access as well as limited interest in electronic communication. A majority of respondents appreciate electronic format. Our August 2019 meeting will explore ways of establishing a telephone network to keep communication lines with non-electronic Cursillistas.

*Clergy Survey and Focus Group exploring how to gain more support from Clergy in Niagara. (Data and access to Huron clergy was limited and almost impossible to gain). Along with an apology for former misunderstandings and misjudgments regarding the experience of and or perceptions of Cursillo will follow the survey plus an opportunity for Clergy to offer reflections and suggestions for change to Cursillo as currently operating in the Niagara Huron movement. By January 2020 a report should appear.

*Held a Day of Deeper Understanding in April. Over 50 people attended in Waterloo, Ontario.

*Ultreyas have attracted Cursillistas from all over the country.

NS/PEI – Unfortunately, we were unable to raise a Men's or Women's team for our fall weekend and had to cancel/postpone the weekend. This was a difficult decision made with a great deal of prayer and thought. We are thankful that our community held us in prayer through our decision making.

Qu'Appelle – We have been approached by Roman Catholic Cursillistas and have met to see how we may mutually encourage and support each other. Currently exploring ideas for a joint Grand Ultreya.

W. Nfld - Welcoming and building relationships with a new bishop, The Rt. Rev. John Organ.

Calgary—Most meetings we do "Lecto Divina" on a passage chosen by Spiritual Director.



A most rewarding part of my job as Chair of CACS is the opportunity to be engaged in conversation with Cursillistas I have met across our country. I am encouraged to hear the enthusiasm for Cursillo and the heartfelt discussions about the challenges and the successes of each movement. Thank you for inviting us into your communities and thank you for your warm hospitality.

Cursillo has come a long way since the '40's when the first Cursillo Weekend was hosted in Spain. Since that time, the Method is held constant, not just in Canada, but worldwide!! I have been re-reading the book "The Fundamental Ideas of the Cursillo Movement" which is a great resource and sums it up quite nicely. If you can, please read it (or read it again).

I am convinced that the success of the Cursillo movement is not a secret. The foundation is on the method that Jesus showed to us—small groups, personal contact and apostolic action as He travelled from place to place to show what the kingdom of God was like. "Follow me," Jesus said to the first disciples. In Him the living God was doing a new thing. This is also part of His invitation to us, part of His summons, part of His way of saying that God is at work in a new way and this is what it looks like. Just as He called the twelve to their mission, He calls us too.

We are hearing how Sponsorship and Small Group Reunion is a challenge across North America. "The purpose of the movement is to make Christian Community possible in the neighborhoods, parishes, work situations and other places where people live the greater part of their lives. It makes possible for anyone in the world to live a Christian life in a natural way." (Leaders Manual Page 13). It is, therefore, a concern and we need to find a way forward.

The point is— like the Twelve—we are called 'to go' and, as Cursillistas, to encourage other leaders 'to go' with us. Please be assured that with trust in Him and His ministry, and our perseverance as we walk in faith, we will be given the strength we need to accomplish His work. If you have any ideas or things that you might be willing to share we want to hear from you.
