Men's and Women's weekends were held in April/May 2012, followed by a combined 4th Day Seminar and Welcome Back Ultreya on June 9th, 2012. As a result of some Secretariat members attending a CLW in New Brunswick in October 2011, changes were made to the Spring Weekends. Ten members attended the 2012 Triennial Conference and General Meeting in Ottawa in June. Secretariat is now working on the development of Guidelines for the Movement. CACS Library manuals have been updated with the latest revisions. Plans are underway to update all Weekend Manuals. Planning and preparations are underway to form and begin a Servant Community and have it in place by January 2013. A Diocesan wide Cursillo Day was held in in September 2012 with a theme of "Feed My Sheep" and was open to all Cursillistas and other interested individuals. Secretariat hosted CACS for their meeting in October 2012. They have asked for prayers for their Movement to see an awakening in our Diocese in men and women to become candidates and a renewed commitment from our new and old Cursillistas to participate in Fourth Day activities. A Grand Ultreya was held in June. The Miramichi area Cursillistas held a picnic for the Anglican community as well as their friends and family in August with over 100 in attendance. A one-day workshop is being held in Saint John in October. They are hoping to start up new Ultreyas in various areas of the Diocese in October/November 2012. Secretariat would like prayers to help them reach young adults to include them in Cursillo.

updating their Policy and Procedures Manual as well as their Weekend Team Manual. At the AGM concern was raised over the lack of people willing to serve on Secretariat. Those in attendance asked Secretariat to hold an evening where the wider community could meet to discuss the future plans for Cursillo and come up with sustainable solutions. This meeting is scheduled for early December 2012. Please pray for the December meeting and that God will guide and strengthen them as they continue the work of Secretariat and that God's will for OACM will be done.

A 30th Anniversary of Cursillo Weekends will be held in Niagara and they have a planning committee working on a celebration. They are planning a service at the Cathedral with both Bishops present and a dinner following. On November 10th they are holding a Leaders School, which will be focussed on the skill set of table enablers but will be useful to all who are seeking to influence their environments. They are hoping this will allow the Weekend training sessions to focus on team building and the flow of the Weekend rather than individuals' skills. October 2012 CACS Meeting

The October CACS meeting was hosted by the Diocese of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island Cursillo Movement October 1-3, 2012. CACS members extended grateful thanks to the Diocesan Secretariat for all they did to organize the details around our meeting and for their generous hospitality.

Much discussion took place concerning the complexities of liability; who is covered and how that coverage is applied. A paper is being prepared to help Diocesan Secretariats to navigate this subject. We are hoping to have something available in the near future.

A new CACS Action Plan for 2012-15 is being developed with the focus of our work to include visiting struggling Movements, holding CLWs in as many Dioceses as possible and offering assistance to all Movements to keep them healthy and authentic.

Guideline Papers - A new guideline paper is almost ready on *Individual and Collective Apostolic Action* and we retired the guideline paper, *How to Support your Local Clergy*. Members felt this guideline was exclusive rather inclusive of the whole people of God and the shared ministry of both clergy and laity, and that we all need support and encouragement in our ministry. The guideline paper *Weekend Team Selection and Development* has had an amendment made to it to include the following as the first bullet under Eligibility Criteria for Team Members – "A Team Member must have completed a Three Day Cursillo Weekend as a candidate, preferably an Anglican Cursillo Weekend." You will find this amended paper under "Guidelines" on the CACS website.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR



To the members of the Canadian Anglican Cursillo family:

Now that my first meeting as Chair of the Canadian Anglican Cursillo Secretariat is over, I can stop worrying about how it will work out and put more energy into the work which needs to be done.

God calls us to use our time and talents, along with our treasure to bring forth the kingdom here on earth. Have you thought about how you will use your time in regard to inviting your friends to experience the fullness of a Cursillo experience? Can you stop for one moment and think about the feelings you had on your Cursillo weekend and then, in the silence of your heart, think of someone who you would like to invite to a similar experience? I am reminding you of this opportunity for Apostolic Action because we are hearing from a number of Dioceses that candidate numbers are down.

Cursillo is such a wonderful gift to the Church; it connects with our Baptismal Covenant and the Anglican Church of Canada's "Marks of Mission". I invite you to go to the CACS website and have a look at the presentation — *Cursillo and the Parishes.* It is a very informative presentation which you could take to your Church and use during a sermon time, or take to your Priest or Synod, etc. and show them what Cursillo is all about. This presentation is a very helpful tool in spreading the word about Cursillo and its place in preparing individuals for mission — engaging us in ministry outside the Church as well as within the Church. Cursillo is a great tool for developing leaders and equipping individuals for leadership. Don't let this gift from God fall by the wayside because there isn't enough time to get involved. God gives us time — it is God's gift to us and we need to make the most of it.

During this past CACS meeting, it was noted with great sadness that the Cursillo Movement in the Anglican Parishes of the Central Interior of British Columbia (APCI) has now officially closed shop. Please volunteer to serve within your Cursillo Movement and participate in Fourth Day activities, so that we don't have to say good bye to yet another Diocesan Cursillo Movement.
