Highlights of the 2015 Canadian Anglican Cursillo Triennial and General Meeting, Lewisporte, Newfoundland, August 28-30

Did you ever feel you were cocooned in a place where love and kindness were the main thoughts of the people surrounding you? Well, that's what it was like to be in Lewisporte in Newfoundland. The team who had been selected to organize the Triennial and to be the "hands and feet of Jesus" on the ground were amazing. What we have always heard about the people from Newfoundland about their joyfulness – it is true – they have this incredible ability to keep smiling and make everyone feel at home.

From the moment we arrived in Lewisporte for our Canadian Anglican Cursillo Secretariat (CACS) meeting, a few days before the Triennial began, until we were leaving, we were looked after with amazing kindness.

The Emmanuel Convention Centre was the scene of the CACS meeting and then the Triennial. It is a huge campus with motel, hotel, cabins, parking for TVs, administrative centre, Christian Bookstore, a Chapel which holds 1,000 people, dining hall for a thousand and many meeting facilities. Staff of the centre was very helpful and took care of our needs quite nicely.

The Triennial began on Friday evening with Registration. This was followed Opening Prayer and Welcome. Then our Keynote Speaker, Bishop Edward Marsh (retired), engaged us in the first of a series of talks on "A Closer Walk with God". The last part of the evening was a night of Newfoundland entertainment and refreshments. We were treated to a "Mummers Party" and what a fun time that was. Afterwards, delicious Newfoundland refreshments were rolled out. What a great night and that was only the beginning.

Saturday morning began with Morning Prayer and then the second session with Bishop Eddie Marsh followed by two choices from three prayer workshops which were offered – Listening to God through Prayer; Hearing God's Voice through Others, and Palanca – Sharing God with Others through Prayer. Two of these were led by members of CACS and the other by Emma Marsh. All were well attended and we thank those who prepared for and led these workshops.

Following lunch, we were treated to the final part of the Bishop Eddie Marsh's talks and what an awesome speaker he was. He had all there listening intently as he spoke about "hearing" God – actually listening for God's voice and having a closer walk with the creator of the universe.

During the "free time" for all other attendees at the Triennial, the Lay Directors or their designate from the Cursillo Movements across the country were involved in a Round Table with CACS. This was the first time ever that a face-to-face gathering of this nature was held for Lay Directors and CACS members. A number of items were discussed and it was the expressed desire of many to have this opportunity to meet together at future Triennials.

A Grand Ultreya was held on Saturday evening and there were at least 125 or more in attendance and it was filled with the Holy Spirit, music, a witness speaker and floating group reunion; a perfect ending to the day.

The Movement is setting up a Servant Community most of the Chairs are already in place ready for the next step. They held their first gathering in June and approximately 25 people attended as Rev. Ed King explained what a servant community should be. There was a lot of sharing of ideas and people left the meeting excited about the possibilities.

In 2015 this Movement held their 27th men's and women's weekends on the same weekend, at the same facility. The men and women had separate accommodations, dining rooms and conference rooms. The closing on Sunday was combined.

In June 2015 they held a Cursillo retreat day the theme was "May I have this dance? An invitation to intimacy." It was a great program with excellent presenters, lots of music, dancing and heartfelt sharing. Lunch was provided by an external group so all were able to participate for the whole day. The turnout was excellent with a good mix of long time and new Cursillistas. They are looking forward to hosting another one in 2016.

They are hoping to expand their annual Cursillo retreat days to two per year in different parts of the diocese

Cursillistas again led the opening prayer and sang a couple of songs at the beginning of their Diocesan Synod. God Alive was repeated again this year and the word from Synod was that they loved the energy and prayer support and the opening set the tone for the day. Bishop John was

very happy with the ongoing witness and support of Cursillo. They feel very blessed by his prayer for them and the time he spent with them.

On April 16th. 2016 they're planning a workshop. They are also hoping to promote a Cursillo Sunday across the diocese.


CACS members studied and revised the Guidelines for:

To the members of the Canadian Anglican Cursillo family:

It is my turn to say hello to you all as I begin my three year term as Chair of the Canadian Anglican Cursillo Secretariat.

This has not been the smoothest of beginnings for me as I have been out of the country looking after my Father who has cancer, one of the scourges of our time. It has been a bit of a scramble to get everything done before our first CACS meeting in a couple of weeks. The time since the Triennial has not unfolded as I expected. My time has not been mine to spend, but has belonged to my Father who needed my constant attention and to an unfamiliar healthcare system. Fatigue and illness has taken more than it's share, too.

I am sure that life for many of you has been difficult and demanding, and has not gone the way you planned or expected. The world seems more uncertain than it did during the joy filled days in Newfoundland last August. Horrific, terrifying events take away our sense of security, making everyday, mundane things, take on sinister shadows, especially in Europe where I was.

We are not blind or immune to the negative things going on in the world but when things start swirling around us we know that we have a place of shelter, a firm place to stand. We don't even have to go anywhere special, we only have to speak and the Creator of the universe listens. We have only to open our hearts and the Lamb will enter and give us Peace. We listen to a song, see the beauty around us, read some ancient words and we are filled with joy beyond our understanding as the Spirit flows through and round us.

We have been given a great gift, a blessing, a promise which we want share with others. As you work with all you have to bring others to the foot of the Cross, I will do all I can to serve and support you.

May we bless others as we are blessed and may our work accomplish more than we can ask or imagine.
