Calling All Cursillistas NOMINATIONS

To do that effectively, the nominating committee should have representation from across the Diocese and be able to work with Parish Representatives. We are currently seeking persons to serve on the Nominating Committee. Are you being called to serve? Please email the nominating committee (nominating.committee@oacm.ca) to volunteer.

At the AGM in September, the Nominating Committee will be putting names forward to fill vacancies coming up on Secretariat. The elected positions (*all two-year terms*) to be filled are: Assistant Lay Director (male- *alternates yearly between male and female*), Treasurer, Weekend Coordinator, and Fourth Day coordinator. The vacant positions to be filled by appointment are: Musica, Communications and Leaders School Coordinator (*also all two-year term positions*). 114th weekend (Men's)

This spring we were pleased to see 20 men experience the gift of God's Grace on the 114th weekend. The Joy and Love that was so evident in the 20 new cursillistas and the team spilled over to the community that faithfully supported the weekend in so many ways. It was a powerful reminder of the importance that the ministry of Cursillo plays in shaping and preparing us to live out our faith.

Parish Representatives

One of the main points that came out of the Secretariat "Visioning" days over the last couple of years was recognition of the vital role that the Parish Representatives play as leaders among leaders, providing a linkage to their Deanery, and for aiding in the important task of communications. On April 30th we held the first Parish Rep Workshop and its focus was on helping the Parish Reps and to better equip them

for carrying out their duties. This was a very successful day and we hope to have more of these events in the future. For more details, see David McCreery's article on the Parish Rep Workshop.

Communications

Although we have been without a Communications Coordinator on Secretariat for almost two years, there have been some improvements in this area. We are getting more frequent requests to post information regarding Ultreya's on our website, people are using the volunteer form on the website to volunteer to serve on team, through the link on our website to CandaHelps.org we are receiving donations electronically, the membership on the OACM Group on Facebook is now up to 85, about 300 people are receiving this Rainbow electronically, and, with the help of Wendy FitzPatrick, the recent redesign of the Diocesan website has resulted in an improved presence for Cursillo (see <http://www.ottawa.anglican.ca/under Growing in Faith..Mature Faith>). It is our prayer that the Communications Coordinator position will be filled at the AGM in Sep so that this important ministry can continue to grow, providing more effective communication to our community.

The AGM is important to us all, as it is at this meeting that Secretariat elections and/or appointments are held/made from the Servant Community. Secretariat is your voice in the activities of the Movement in the Diocese. It is at the AGM that the budget is approved and direction for the upcoming year received. We urge everyone to plan to attend this important event!

Job Descriptions for Secretariat Positions

Assistant Lay Director (Male - *elected*)

The position of Assistant Lay Director is a one-year learning position. Its intent is to enable the incumbent to become familiar with all the aspects of the Lay Director's position. This facilitates continuity and consistency, when he or she becomes the Lay Director the following year.

Fourth Day (Post-Cursillo) Coordinator (*elected*)

The Post-Cursillo, or Fourth Day coordinator, is responsible to the Secretariat for promoting and assisting all members of the Movement in Group Reunion and Ultreya, ensuring that parish level contact is established and maintained, and that promotional forms and materials are current and available. He/she officiates at Grand Ultreyas, but may delegate this function where appropriate. This is a two-year elected position.

Treasurer (*elected*)

The Treasurer offers all financial services and support to the Ottawa Anglican Movement by providing good stewardship. This is a two-year elected position.

Weekend Coordinator (*elected*)

The Weekend Coordinator coordinates all of the activities related to the Cursillo weekends organized by the Ottawa Anglican Cursillo Movement. This role includes: obtaining the physical facilities and all related amenities; selecting future lay rectors along with members of Secretariat's discernment committee; providing useful information to assist with team formation and ensuring that the team Eucharist supplies are available for all weekend related events. This is a

This is a two-year elected position.

Musica (*appointed*)

Musica coordinates the music requirements of the movement as they pertain to Secretariat meetings/functions and Cursillo weekends. This would include copyright and liaising with weekend musicians. The person occupying this position is appointed for a two-year term.

Communications Coordinator (*appointed*)

The Communications Coordinator coordinates the ways in which the OACM communicates between Secretariat and the membership as well as the larger community. This role includes: overseeing the content and the coordination of the OACM website and the publication of The Rainbow; coordinating the OACM booth at Synod; keeping current files related to Cursillo pamphlets, PowerPoint presentations and talks used to inform the community and promote the OACM. This position is appointed by Secretariat for a two-year term.

Leaders' School/Servant Community Coordinator (*appointed*)

The function of the Leaders' School/Servant Community Coordinator is to work with Secretariat and oversee educational events. (The Servant Community is the "working" body, one function of which is the Leaders' School.) The general purpose of such events is to provide an awareness of our unity of purpose for Christ and to provide leadership-training opportunities for Cursillistas. In so doing, a deeper understanding of the Cursillo method is achieved that ultimately strengthens Group Reunions, Ultreyas, weekend teams, and emphasizes the Fourth Day. This position is appointed by Secretariat for a two-year term.

Canadian Anglican Cursillo Triennial Conference

Every three years the national body of the Anglican Cursillo Movement holds a conference. In 2009 it was in Halifax and in 2006 in Calgary. Next year, the Ottawa Anglican Cursillo Movement has

the honour of hosting this important event. Please mark your calendars for the weekend of June 22nd – 24th, 2012. This will be an incredible opportunity for Cursillistas in our area to meet members of the National Movement and attend many interesting talks and seminars. Our present plans are that it will be held at Carleton University and our guest speaker for this weekend will be Rev. Chuck Owens from South Carolina. Chuck is a gifted and engaging speaker, a Cursillista and has served on many teams as well as being Head Spiritual Advisor. There are over 250 Cursillistas in his own congregation! They claim to be the most active community of Cursillistas in the Diocese of South Carolina.

The theme of the weekend is "**Christ is Counting on You**" (**Matthew 28:19-20**), and what a perfect topic for us to focus on. Cursillo continues to play such an important role in each of our lives and our churches. This conference will help to strengthen our commitment to Christ as well as rekindle the spark that many of us experienced on our own weekends. Stay tuned for future updates, but I encourage each of you to set aside this weekend NOW. It may be a very long time before we will have the opportunity to host and experience one of these conferences. Again the dates are **June 22nd-24th, 2012**.

Is Your Prayer Life Comfy?

I have been doing a lot of thinking about prayer in the last while. I have been blessed over my life with having been uplifted and surrounded in prayer, and of late I have been particularly grateful for that support. Recently as I was having some difficulty with not having the energy to do much, a good friend suggested that, where I might not have the energy to get out and about, what I *could* do was pray. She was right and I decided to

start keeping a prayer journal. I have kept journals for years and they often included prayers, but I had never had a journal dedicated specifically to that. I started it about 3 months ago and I love it. It has been a wonderful way for me to keep track how God is working. I have included spaces for the entry date and room to include updates. Definitely something I'm going to keep doing.

In May, I attended the Praying Congregations conference with Jane Vennard. She shared with us some wonderful teaching on prayer. Jane spoke about her belief that prayers are always heard and that in the action of praying for others, not only is their threshold lowered to be more available to God's love, but ours is too. She also spoke about the difference in saying prayer and being prayer, and how we can intentionally honour God in our everyday activities. I attended a pre-conference workshop in which Jane talked with us about using our bodies in prayer. Some of us were taken out of our comfort zones, but by the end of the afternoon, the room was filled with the sharing of positive experiences.

Maybe my first question should have been worded, "Is your prayer life **too** comfy?" I think mine was. Looking back over the last six months or so, I have seen where God has been doing some stretching in my faith life and I think He is asking me to step out of my comfort zone a little more often. As I step up and step out, I'm eager to see what new experiences will be included in my journal.

Parish Representative Workshop

Well we did it! Some two-dozen Cursillistas gathered at St. Thomas the Apostle Anglican Church on Saturday, April 30th to discuss the health of the movement and what might be done to ensure that it continues to be the amazing tool that it is. One of the goals of your Secretariat is to ensure that everyone has a voice in the movement. The function of Parish Representative is the vital link in the chain.

Parish Representatives know their communities. Parish Representatives will have the ear of Secretariat. That linkage is considered vital to the continued health of the movement.

There continues to be room to grow. At present, only 50% of the Parishes have a Representative. It is possible that you are a Cursillistas who does not currently have a Representative. If that is the case, then it is suggested that you approach your Parish Priest and advise him or her that you would like to fulfill that function. Once you have done that then go the OACM website and submit a note to the Secretariat advising us that another Parish is represented.

The first Parish Representative Workshop was a bit of an experiment. We used the tried-and-true Weekend approach of small group discussion interspersed with live music, good food and fellowship to provide an appropriate atmosphere to encourage the exchange of ideas. Lay Director, Derek Reid, provided participants with a brief outline of what Secretariat hopes to achieve with Parish Representatives and at the workshop. Two seasoned Cursillistas, Michael Perkin and David Piercey led the gathering in the morning and afternoon sessions respectively. Michael asked us to consider the five W's, "Who, What, When, Where and Why"? in responding to the morning focus on Group Reunions and Ultreyas. In the afternoon David encouraged the table discussion to focus on the building of relationships. He emphasized the critical role Cursillo plays in supporting faith and relationships with God and with each other. We were encouraged to use our gifts to serve others. David reminded us that we are more likely to be attracted to a Christian who has joy in their heart. So we should go about our activities with that as our focus.

The table and plenary discussions were lively and productive. The on-the-spot evaluation clearly indicated that the initiative was welcome and met the expectation of almost everyone at the gathering. Constructive criticism can be as helpful as praise and we will use that to try to improve on what is done as we move forward.

Of the many ideas and criticisms that were raised here are a few that stand out:

- Communication is the key. So advertise *all*

Ultreyas widely; use speakers “from away”; be flexible – modify the format to suit needs. Use all available means including Facebook, Rainbow, and Crosstalk.

- Sharing of and at Ultreyas needs to be looked at. There are lots of tools available. The key is to find the one(s) that work for your group. Some ideas might include using larger floating groups for discussion after the 4th Day talk. There might be a place for Table leaders to facilitate discussion. There may be a place for spontaneous witness/feedback sessions on occasion. Should the hosting of Central Ultreyas amongst Deaneries be explored? Some see the Yellow Card as a good tool. But it can also be seen as somewhat rigid.
- Flexibility. Be open to change. Don’t oversell Cursillo; let it speak for itself through you and your actions.
- Friendship. Get to know the person and their needs before introducing the idea of Cursillo. Encourage your own involvement and mentorship in your friend’s life. Remember that sponsorship carries with it certain ongoing responsibilities that need to be considered seriously. Use available opportunities such as Coffee Hour as openings to friendship.
- Diocesan support. While Cursillo is a lay movement it works best when it is fully supported by the Church structure. Prayerful thought and action are sometimes called for to overcome obstacles. Cursillo is not a secret society. It does not have a special handshake. But it can raise countless suspicions on the part of others when overly enthusiastic Cursillistas overwhelm them. We need to learn best practices.
- Deanery support. Is there a need for a Deanery Cursillo Representative? Should Deanery Representatives or Parish Representatives be encouraged to champion causes at the Deanery level? Can these “best practices” become the basis for future Parish Representative Workshops?

So what happens next? Your Secretariat will spend some time analyzing what was said at the Workshop. The major themes that Parish Representatives identified need further examination. Is it possible to identify two or three individuals who would like to explore these further? Their ideas/suggestions could become the basis for future

sessions and broader training for all. If you would like to be a part of this process please let us know.

You can expect to hear more about Parish Representative in the future. This Workshop was just the start. Some things are straight-forward. Have Cursillistas moved? Should they still receive the Rainbow? Are there movement related issues with those who have been given the gift of the 4th Day but are not active? Do you know potential candidates in your Parish for future teams, for Secretariat?

You are our ears to the ground. Thanks for listening.

A Message From Your Treasurer

It is hard to believe that four years have gone by since I accepted the position of treasurer for the Movement. It has indeed been a privilege and a blessing to serve you and our Lord in this great organization. As most of you know our constitution states that the maximum number of years that one can serve on Secretariat are two consecutive two year terms. I believe that this turnover of executive members has led to the success of our movement as no-one can take ownership of it, and new faces are welcome who can bring energy and new ideas forward. It is now time for someone like you to now share in this blessing.

It does not take much time – as a matter of fact – just over a hundred hours per year. A copy of the description is available on the website www.oacm.ca. Choose volunteer on the left menu and click on treasurer to get an idea of what is involved. Then go to the bottom of the volunteer menu and fill out the volunteer form. If you are familiar with “Microsoft excel” the job can be easy indeed and I would be glad to help you get started.

I should also mention that during these difficult financial times our “Gifts of Love” are well below that of last year and we are

well below that of last year and we are currently with \$5000 less at our disposal than we were at this time last year.

Secretariat expenses include not only the costs of Weekends, but all of the other ongoing work that is required to maintain the health of the movement including such items as the Web site, production and mailing of the *Rainbow* (It costs approximately one dollar for each person to receive the *Rainbow* by mail and we encourage you to enrol to receive this by e-mail if you have not already done so), as well as support of The National Secretariat and representation to National. In June of 2012 The OACM is hosting the National Cursillo Triennial General Meeting and Conference which will place an additional strain on our financial situation.
